PPPL, the University, and other employers in the area will join together to help people in the local communities through the United Way of Greater Mercer County's annual fund-raising campaign. This year's theme is: *What Matters*. On Tuesday, November 14, PPPL is hosting the annual United Way meeting for employees at 9:30 A.M. in the MBG Auditorium. This meeting will provide information about United Way programs and will feature a presentation by Steven Rosen, Executive Director of the Millhill Child & Family Development Corp. in Trenton, an organization supported by the United Way. There will be refreshments and a tricky-tray raffle (see list of prizes on page 2). United Way of Greater Mercer County representative Rod Robertson is also scheduled to deliver remarks at the PPPL meeting.

Donations may be given as a one-time contribution or through payroll deductions. The University will match 15 cents per dollar for all contributions made through payroll deduction and 10 cents per dollar for all other gifts. All donations will be distributed to United Way programs in Mercer County or employees' home communities or to other health and human services agencies that are designated by individual donors.

United Way of Greater Mercer County funds local health and human service programs in the greater Mercer County area that have an impact on the community by: Helping Children Succeed, Fostering Self-Sufficiency, Caring for Seniors and People with Disabilities, and Accessing Healthcare. Donors can choose to make general or specific contributions. They can provide contributions that are divided among all

United Way-supported programs, among all programs in an area of interest, or among all except for a particular program. With a minimum gift of \$52, they can designate a contribution to a United Way in their home community, to any specific program supported by the United Way, or to any charitable health or human care organization with a 501(c)3 tax status that is not supported by the United Way. While the historic focus of United Way is on home communities, it also is possible to direct gifts to agencies that provide health or human care in other countries.
